General conditions for the open-call

Who can apply?

Everyone that has sufficient information on a NbS case study can submit a poster proposal.

How can I submit my proposal?

You are invited to apply through the short form available on the NetworkNature website.

What should my proposal look like?

On a first moment, it is only needed to have link to the case study in Network Nature case study finder, a link to another website or a short description of the NbS.

How will my proposal be selected?

The selection process will take into consideration the relevance of the case study, the clarity and quality of information available, considering both visual and informative content (technical details of the action, concrete social, environmental or economic benefits, etc.).

Once the proposals are accepted, authors will be asked to submit a poster following <u>this A1 template</u>. If they do not have the resources to edit the poster, NetworkNature can provide support once the authors provide all the information required to create the posters, including sufficient high-quality pictures and images.

What is the timeline?

We invite you to submit your idea **by 23rd August.** Proposals will be reviewed on a rolling basis until.

What happens if my proposal is selected?

NetworkNature will print all the posters in A1 for NN Annual Event and can provide support in doing the layout if the authors provide all the textual and visual information needed.




